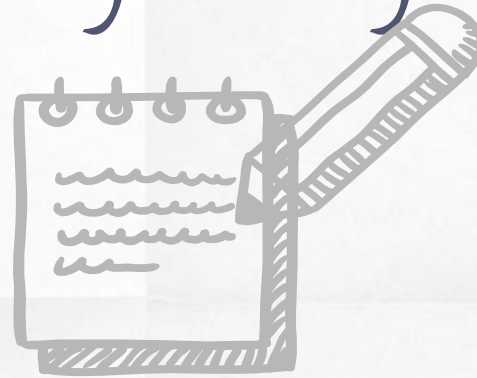

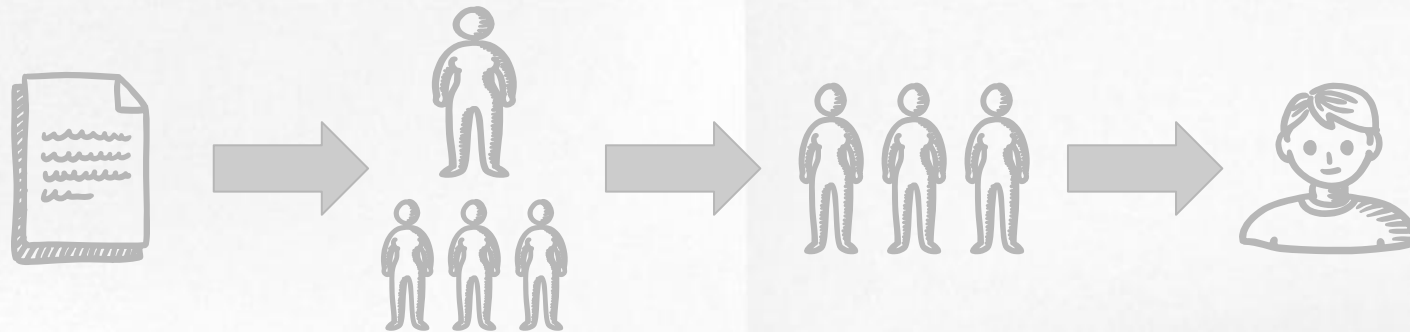

Sequence of Activities



1	Students study an exemplar text to understand text structure and author's stylistic techniques
2	Whole class co-constructs a model text based on exemplar text from Activity 1
3	Students work in groups to develop a text based on knowledge and skills from Activities 1 and 2
4	Students independently write in the mode demonstrated

Activity 1

1. Number the paragraphs
2. Circle/highlight the controlling idea/thesis
3. Underline the supporting evidence (facts, details)
4. Write the purpose of each paragraph using the [comment feature](#)

Activity 3

1. Understand Writing Prompt for Task and Topic.
2. Brainstorm possible topics in groups.
3. Group selects a topic and generate ideas/details (possible sources of information?)
4. Group generates Thesis ideas and selects one through consensus
